MENTOR COMMITMENTS

Mentors commit to:

- Work with mentee for 6-12 months, and meet at least once each quarter.
- Prepare discussion topics and assignments.
- Facilitate discussions, ask questions, and provide guidance.
- If you need to reschedule a session, let mentee know as far in advance as possible.

Mentor and mentee arrange the frequency, length, and mode of mentoring sessions (inperson, phone, or video call).
