
How the adoption of a collective impact model can help to:

What is a collective impact model?

Organizational Structure of Memphis Fast Forward



(FSG, n.d.)

- Coming together to address the needs and interests of the collective whole
- Recognizes that you can have a greater impact working together
- Not about creating something new and duplicative - the opposite
- Differs from collaboration
 - Centralized infrastructure
 - Dedicated staff and resources
 - Structured process and strategy
