

Identifying Effective Strategies for Economic Growth and Community Impact

The results emphasize the need for a balanced approach combining financial and non-financial incentives. Financial tools like grants and rebates remain the backbone of economic development, but non-financial support enhances their reach and effectiveness. By addressing identified challenges—such as funding constraints and outreach gaps—municipalities and counties can expand their impact, particularly in underserved areas.

Targeted adjustments, such as tying incentives to community-focused metrics and leveraging partnerships, will maximize ROI and foster inclusive economic growth, aligning closely with the overarching goals of this research.

Incentive Points

- Sales Tax Generating limit no more than 2 pad sites may be initially developed for non-sales tax generating uses; multi-tenant building – initial tenants minimum 50% sales tax generating tenants
- Incentive is Phased
 - Phase 1 Construction Acceptance
 - Phase 2 \$7 million total taxable sales
 - Phase 3 \$9 million total taxable sales
 - Maximum \$6.5M in rebate of TIF generated from properties in the incentive above base set at the time agreement negotiated
- Reporting
 - Monthly report of contacts with retailers
 - Insurance insuring Town and FURA
 - Annual report to Assessor of improvements
 - Property Taxes Paid Some lots are no longer owned by the developer
- Tracking
 - Property tax values, Mills, Assessments
 - Sale tax –Statutory Town not self-collect
